**Michael's Musings**

We have been enjoying some great weather in the last couple of weeks. We are not even into spring yet, but there are buds appearing on some trees. Hopefully, our wonderful outside temperatures do not portend some higher temperatures in the summer. However, now is the time to relish our coming springtime.

Growing up in Rome, New York, I was able to experience some really cold and snowy winters. The advent of springtime meant that the cold would soon fade and the warmth of summer was not far off. Even now I remember the snowmelt that created little rivers along sidewalks and roadways. It was interesting to me that I could actually smell the concrete as the snow receded. I knew that smell meant change was coming.

Now, springtime for me involves focusing more attention on college basketball – you know the team. Football is over and baseball is another month or so away. So springtime provides a transition between cultural sports rituals. At church, however, we experience a different kind of ritual – Lent. The word “Lent”, actually means “springtime”, comes from Old English “lencten” that changed in Middle English to “lente.” It first came into use in the 13<sup>th</sup> century.

The 40 days of Lent started in the 4<sup>th</sup> century. This was a time when candidates for baptism fasted in preparation of their baptisms at Easter. The number 40 refers to the time that Moses spent on Mt. Sinai with God, the numbers of days Elijah walked to Mt. Horeb, and the time Jesus spent in the wilderness. Ash Wednesday is the kickoff for Lent with the conclusion on Holy Saturday.

In the early centuries of the church the observance of fasting was a strict endeavor. Only one meal a day was to be eaten. This meal was consumed in the evening. Also, no meat or fish or eggs were to be eaten. By the 9<sup>th</sup> century the fasting was relaxed. By the 15<sup>th</sup> century it became the custom to eat at noon.

Fasting helped to make the body “right.” In addition the hunger pains reminded a person of their hunger for God. Fasting is still a practice to follow through Lent.

The season of Lent is observed as a time of penance, showing our sorrow for things we have done. Almsgiving is practiced so that the poor are helped. Generally, Lent is the time to devote more than the usual time to religious activities. All these activities

are meant to draw us closer to God. It is my hope and prayer that you discover a way, which best suits you to find a closer relationship with God.

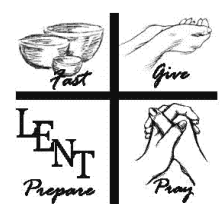

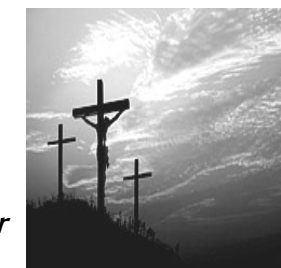

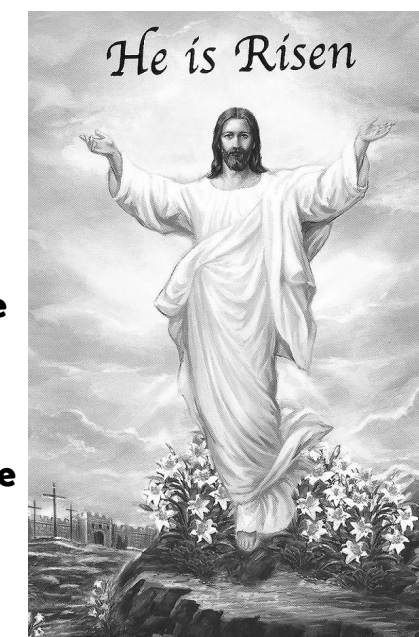

### Cranberry Squares by Gatha Warner

Ingredients needed:  
1 cup flour,  
1 cup brown sugar, packed  
1 tsp. salt,  
1 cup butter,  
16 oz can Cranberry Sauce, jellied  
2 1/3 cups quick cook oatmeal, uncooked

Mix flour, sugar and oatmeal, cut in butter to a crumbly mixture. Place half crumb mixture into a 13x9x2 baking dish.  
Pat down by hand. Spread a thin layer of cranberry sauce (beaten to make spreading easier.)  
Sprinkle remaining crumbs over top, patting smooth.  
Bake in moderate oven 350 degrees, approx. 30-45 minutes or until brown.  
I don't add salt when making these and use unsalted butter. At times I have used the berry cranberry sauce in lieu of jellied. Enjoy!
